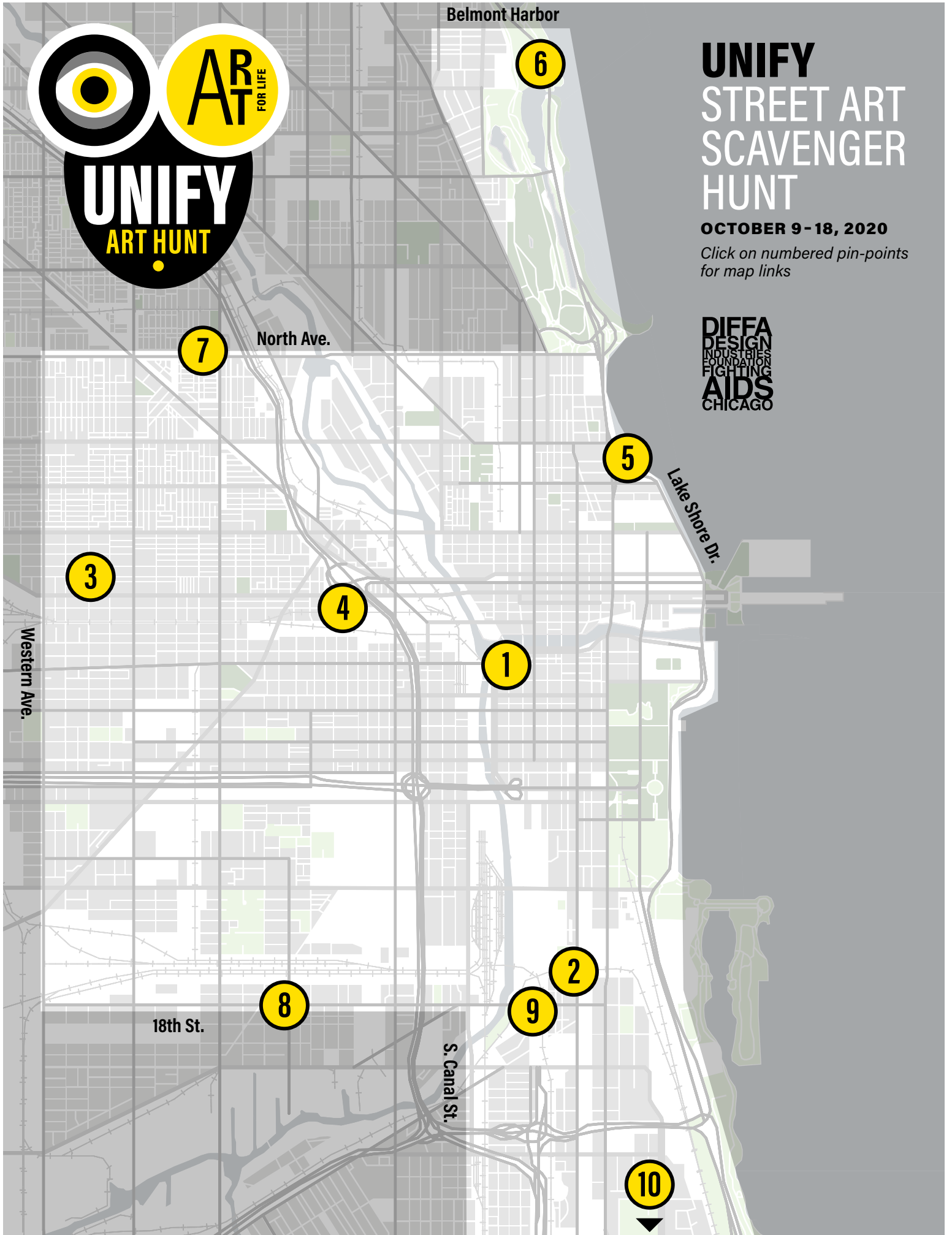

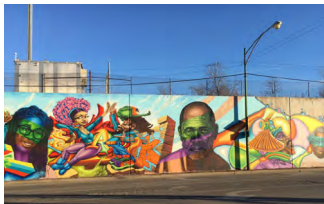
SOUTH LOOP / NEAR SOUTH SIDE

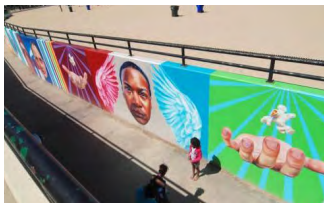
WEST LOOP / WEST TOWN

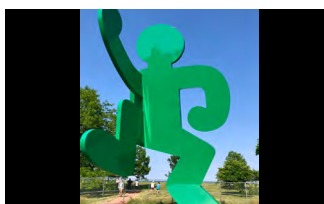
OLD TOWN / GOLD COAST

The Declaration of Immigration by Sal Jimenez & Others

This artwork not only speaks to Pilsen's current Mexican-American population but its past — when the neighborhood served as a landing place for many European ethnic groups.

Painted in the midst of a once thriving business and economic hub of the African-American community, this mural documents the migration of African Americans from the South to Chicago after World War II — specifically to the Douglas Boulevard and Grand Avenue area.
